## A word from our Rector

---

Dear Friends,

Once again, it's hard to believe: Lent is almost upon us!

Ash Wednesday is February 18; we'll be offering three services on that day: 7:30 and 10:00 a.m., and 7:00 p.m., each of these Holy Eucharist with Imposition of Ashes. The early service will be spoken, the two later ones each with music. Let's make a special point this year of beginning our Lenten journey together. I invite all of us to make every effort to attend and participate in one of these services.

In the course of this year, it's my intention to place a heightened focus on personal spiritual growth—our ongoing formation in Christian discipleship. It's so easy to try to find life fulfillment by manipulating the externals: "If only things 'out there' were better, all would be well." But the only way we truly find growth, peace, and joy is from the inside out. Not as a private project we undertake on our own, but from the renewal that comes by Grace from God—the One utterly other who is nevertheless closer to us than our own hearts. The project starts from the center, and then radiates outwards.

Spiritual growth is intimidating, because it changes things—and we're no longer in control. This is why we often get ourselves caught in various ways. We can tell ourselves that the classic tools just aren't effective anymore. But at least some of the time, maybe it's possible that the problem is that they're *too* effective! It's not comfortable—at first—not being in charge. Later though, living as though God really is God, we get to the only comfort that really endures. So, let's help one another learn to let the distancing mechanisms go, and step forward into God's abundant, risky gift to us in Jesus Christ, the one "in whom is life."

With God, there's always more to learn, and always more in which to grow. The wonderful truth is that it is possible—more than merely possible—to live in an increased sense of the living presence of our good Lord. Why not, then?

In the words of our Prayer Book:

"I invite you, therefore, in the name of the Church, to the observance of a holy Lent, by self examination and repentance; by prayer, fasting, and self denial; and by reading and meditating on God's holy Word."

It is such a providence that we're in this great adventure together. Thank you.

## **THE LABYRINTH (FEBRUARY 13th)**

Our labyrinth community is growing in numbers of people sharing the monthly walking experience. It is also extending the scope of activities around and on the labyrinth. Our church is fortunate to have a canvas, Chartres - style to unfold in the Parish Hall for personal walks and group facilitated walks. We extend an invitation to people from all faiths, especially those who are in transition and/or struggling to find a means of prayer or meditation.

Facilitated walks are led by Dr. Margaret Rappaport, a Veriditas-certified facilitator. She studied with Rev. Lauren Artress at Grace Episcopal Cathedral, San Francisco, CA. and is an active, committed participant in the global labyrinth movement. Veriditas is dedicated to inspiring personal and planetary change and renewal through the labyrinth experience. We accomplish our mission by training and supporting labyrinth facilitators around the world, and offering meaningful events that promote further understanding of the labyrinth as a tool for personal and community transformation. Our vision is that the labyrinth experience guides us in developing the higher level of human awareness we need to thrive in the 21st century.

Dr. Rappaport lectures on images, labyrinths and other symbols. She speaks on the history of labyrinths, the concept of the labyrinth, sacred geometry, archetypal symbols, and subtle energies in stories and symbols. Her book, *Bringing Life to the Labyrinth* is available in Galley West and on Amazon.com.

## FRIDAYS IN LENT

We will continue our Fridays in Lent this year on February 20 continuing through March 27. At 5:00 p.m., in church, a diverse series of short services will be held in church. These will include both the traditional Stations of the Cross, as well as a number of other alternative offerings. At 5:30 a soup and bread supper will be held in the Parish Hall. And at 6:15, we'll begin the evening's program. (The only exception to this pattern will be on March 13, when we'll begin in the Parish Hall at 5:00 for Labyrinth followed by simple Eucharist, followed by the soup and bread supper.)

The programs this year will be hosted by our Justice and Peace Committee: "LENTEN CONVERSATIONS 2015: RACE, POLITICS, and RELIGION IN THE USA." This series will include film showings, panel discussions, and group conversations. These will be timely and compelling opportunities.

## BOOK RECOMMENDATION FROM THE RECTOR

Fostering our focus on spiritual growth this year, I'd like to offer a suggestion for our personal reading experience that many of us might share in the coming months, leading to some group sessions and reflections in Adult Education in the early fall.

It's a Christian classic that also pushes the envelope: *Revelations of Divine Love*, by Julian of Norwich. I have a further suggestion in the particular edition that I'd recommend we use. Some translations of this great work are frankly cumbersome; others get close to being paraphrases. However, a fairly new translation, very accurate, but also compellingly readable is the version by Elizabeth Spearing. It's available as follows:

*Revelations of Divine Love*  
Julian of Norwich  
Elizabeth Spearing, translator  
Penguin Classics (1999)  
ISBN-13: 978-0140446739

This is a direct volume, and not that long. However, I won't disguise the fact that reading a medieval devotional work, this one included, is not without its challenges for twenty-first century readers. Nevertheless, these challenges are very much worth it, and there's much that addresses us in great relevance and power. Julian is one of the great theological minds in the history of the church—and a brilliant writer. She has a way of speaking from the center—and going right out to the edge.

So, I invite us to read together; meditate, wonder, question, and grow.

## PLANNED GIVING, CALENDAR YEAR 2015

The Planned Giving Committee, formed in 2008, is working on their “2015 Program”. During 2013, the Committee added the Planned Giving Program to the church Web Site. (Please visit our web site: [holyspiritolean.org](http://holyspiritolean.org)) We offered information on Charitable Gift Annuities; have introduced a “Family Legacy Plan” and members have participated in Fr. Adam’s “Taking Care of Business” program.

Over the years, our parishioners have added monies to The Church of the Holy Spirit invested funds by including the Church in their financial and/or Estate Plans. Thanks to the new Planned Giving Program bequests have been added to the General Fund; The Endowment Fund; and The Nickerson Endowment Fund. All monies received are deposited in the appropriate investment accounts managed by the Diocesan Trust Funds (DIT).

Also in 2014, \$184,137 was transferred from our DIT Investment Accounts, named above, to our Operating Account to support our church budget. Without the generous financial support of former parishioners and the prudent management of our investment accounts we could not maintain our Operating Budget.

Members of the PG Committee have participated in the Stewardship program and are pleased that 65 members of our parish have indicated an interest to include our church in the estate and financial plans.

The Planned Giving Committee meets monthly, January through May, formulating plans to offer our parishioners financial alternatives when considering our church in their financial decisions. New members are always welcome to offer new ideas.
